Elmore Rouse - Chairman, Riddle Evangelistic Association

May 17, 1922 - August 21, 2009

Elmore Rouse, 87, of Wilmington, NC, died Friday, August 21, 2009 at Topsail Beach, NC.

He was born in Duplin Co., NC, on May 17, 1922, the son of the late Norwood and Ada Scott Rouse. He was preceded in death by four brothers and two sisters.

In September 1989, after 43 years of service, he retired as President and Chairman of the Board of Mayrand, Inc., in Greensboro, NC. He was an active member and deacon of Parkway Baptist Church in Greensboro until his move to Topsail Beach where he became actively involved with Emma Anderson Memorial Chapel, serving on the Board of Governors and as Chairman of the Board. He was a founder and, for 33 years, board member of the Riddle Evangelistic Association. In 1942 he enlisted in the US Army and served in active duty in Europe in World War II. Through the years, he was actively involved in the Veterans of Foreign Wars, was founder of the National Pharmaceutical Alliance and traveled extensively with his wife throughout the world.

Surviving is his wife of 62 years, Edith George Rouse; daughter, Pamela Rouse Burke and husband, John, of Topsail Beach, NC; son, James Lee Rouse and wife, Susan, of Greensboro, NC; five grandchildren, Adrian Rouse, Christine Parbst, Jennifer Underwood, David Burke, the late Christopher Rouse; two step grandchildren, Chris and Sarah Oliver; four great grandchildren and one step great grandchild.
